Dear Friends and Family,

Intense, would be a suitable adjective for first quarter of this new year. Time and time again God has carried us through difficulties, and met every need. He has provided, protected and blessed ... beyond what we could imagine. We know it's a team effort, and that the Lord uses people to be His hands and feet here on Earth. So we are thankful for all who have prayed and given of their time and their blood, sweat and tears for us, as well as materially and financially too. Every drop, every crumb and every cent is appreciated and has made a difference.



You may remember the **urgent call for help** when one of the Bulembu teenagers, Bongekile, was involved in a freak car accident in Bulembu in February. She needed 9 units of blood to save her life – after-hours, and when the Blood Bank was closed. Through the prayer hot-line, the rapid response of the church family rallying to donate blood that night, and the dedication of the medical teams at the various hospitals involved who worked through the night to keep her alive, her life was spared, and her leg has been saved. Bongekile's journey back to full recovery may be a long one, but we are eternally grateful to all who played a part in preserving her life and her leg.





Blood is often in short supply in Eswatini. Bulembu has responded to this crisis by committing to hold regular blood-drives, inviting the national Blood Bank to travel to Bulembu several times a year. Additionally, Potter's Wheel has an active WhatsApp group of willing blood donors who can be called upon in emergencies. No matter the time, or the distance they have to drive give their blood, they have proven to be selfless. What a church family!





The accident happened whilst we were in Phoenix Arizona for the

Tenors Concert, with Vernon and Leigh and four of the Bulembu young adults. Despite everyone's underlying concern for Bongekile, the concert was fantastic. The Tenors were brilliant, and so encouraging and kind to the four young people as they all sang together. Our team sang with their hearts and gave a performance of joy that brought a standing ovation. It was really an uplifting, feel-good evening, and an amazing experience for the four. We're so proud of them, proving to be such great ambassadors for the children of Bulembu. And we're very thankful to the Tenors for holding Bulembu in their hearts. We can't thank them enough for so graciously and generously investing their time and talent for the benefit of Bulembu. It is so much appreciated. **Partners In Action** hosted the event. For us it was lovely to see Joshua growing in his new role of Executive Director of PIA, and serving CMS & Bulembu from across the ocean.













-The ICBCs are growing. The **24**th **ICBC** is now well established. With a plan to plant 4 more churches by the end of 2022.

-The **maize fields** of the ICBCs are growing, some of them helped along by new wells with solar-driven pumps. Water-capturing systems are now functional on all 24 sites.

-The **pre-schools** are growing. We now have 20 of them. In total, they are caring **for over 780 orphaned and vulnerable children in the ICBC sponsorship programme**, providing nutritious meals for the preschoolers throughout the week, and distributing rice packs to families in dire need.

-In this first quarter of 2022, approximately **240,000** rice meals have been distributed through ICBCs, which amounts to almost 1.8 million meals since last July. These rice meals come to us from Dayton CLC, who sacrificially give their time and resources to provide and pack them for the ICBCs throughout Eswatini. This year, some of the Potter's Wheel congregants happened to be in Dayton just at the right time to help with the packing!

-The number of ICBC pastors in Bible school is growing. There are currently 29 pastors in training. They spend 1 week a month at Potter's Wheel doing ISOM. Since inception, 65 pastors have graduated through the ISOM Bible school, 21 of these, to degree level. We're thankful to Dayton CLC for funding the pastor's training too

At the beginning of February, we held a joyous ISOM graduation ceremony, with 31 graduates, comprised of ICBC pastors along with Potter's Wheel congregants. Shaun and Alison Finlay and Khosi Manana do a marvelous job of running ISOM. This













year they already have 72 students on the programme.



- At the TC Men's Centre, the piggery is growing. There has recently been rapid multiplication, thanks to some new breeding sows, so we now have 148 pigs at Hawane, and Julius is looking to double that in the future. He is introducing a new deep litter system which seems to be beneficial for conservation of water and for waste disposal. Best, I think, must be the benefit that the pig pens now 'don't smell at all' (or so they say).






- The TC Women's Centre is growing in power. **Solar power!** This came as a generous gift from Standard Bank, who officially unveiled this exciting new project in early March, on International Women's Day. It's going to be a big cost-saving for the Centre, and is a great blessing.





-In the Bulembu forest, the eucalyptus trees are growing too. The new **Bulembu Essential Oils** project was launched in 2020, as Bulembu's biggest sustainability project yet.
