But we are continually inspired by our colleagues and partners around the world who respond at the forefront of these difficult situations and encourage us that God is hearing our prayers and using our gifts to make a tangible difference in the poorest communities on earth.

This week we've had the privilege of welcoming Emmanual Murangira, our Country Director for Rwanda, to Scotland. Emmanuel has been touring churches around the country and meeting with government officials to share more of the reality of how our projects are bringing hope and a future to families who are struggling to put food on the table during a climate crisis and Covid pandemic.

His message is one of hope. He told us that in one Scottish Government funded programme alone, our partners have supported 30,000 families to be released from extreme poverty. The impact of this is huge. The lives of individuals, households and entire communities – completely transformed.

Good news! Scottish funding for Burkina Faso.



We recently welcomed <u>The Scottish Government's announcement</u> of funding to help Tearfund partners in Burkina Faso respond to the ongoing humanitarian situation there. The government's Humanitarian Emergency Fund was set up to respond to crises in our world which are often overlooked and under-reported, but where the need is very real and urgent. These crucial funds will enable our partners to provide a lifeline to families who are most vulnerable as a result of the ongoing conflict, providing basic supplies and also helping prevent further trauma through training around protection for sexual abuse and exploitation of children.
